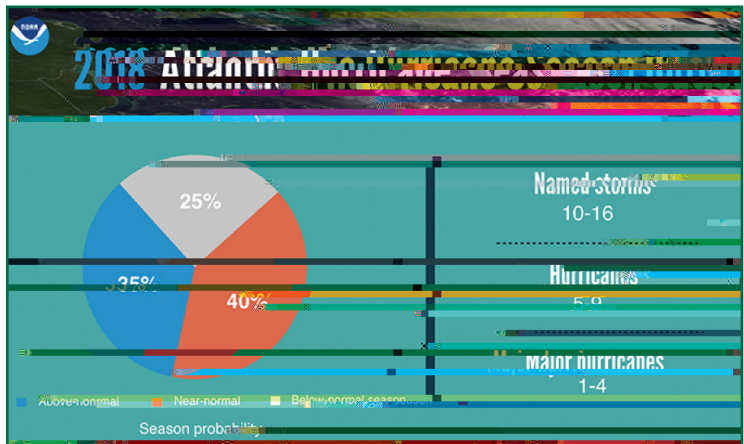

2018 Hurricane Season Outlook

The National Hurricane Center (NHC) has issued its outlook for the 2018 hurricane season. The outlook indicates a near-normal season with 10-16 named storms and 5-6 hurricanes. The probability of a major hurricane (Category 3 or higher) is 1-4%. The outlook is based on current climate conditions and is subject to change as the season progresses.
