

CAMPUS MONUMENT SIGNAGE GETS REVAMPED

The signage project took four weeks for planning and pricing and an additional four weeks for construction. Chaddy Hanwisai, Campus Planning Project Manager, says the most challenging part of the project was scheduling sign removal, monument repair, and sign installation so no monuments were missing for long durations. The project came in on time and under budget even with the additional sign at SVC.
