: Researchers at the University of South Horida conducted a statewide survey of 600 Horidians to measure public opinion on a variety of current policy issues. The result presented in this report address attitudes toward higher education and student loan debt. The survey included a representative sample of Horidians, fielded between July 15<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Topline results are reported below with a confidence level of 95% and a margin of error +/- 4.

- Two-thirds of Horidians (67%) favor an extension of the pause on student loan repayments that was initiated in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Most Floridians (61%) either somewhat or strongly agree that a college education is necessary in order to succeed in America today.
