A. Overall Criteria

Unlike the process for Tenure and Promotion, the University of South Florida requires the evaluation to employ the ratings of "Outstanding," "Strong," "Satisfactory," "Weak," or "Unacceptable" for each area of the candidate's assigned duties. If 100 percent of the candidate's assignment is in teaching, then the candidate will only be evaluated in that one area. If the candidate has multiple categories of assigned duties (e.g., teaching and administration), then the category with the higher percentage of assign(t)-5(a)-T(d)(h)-0.7(e)9(51.Urp)9(65)9.0.

Faculty members will make use of all materials provided in the candidate's file in order to evaluate the candidate's teaching.
