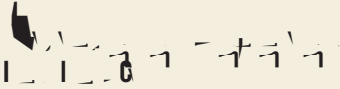

Course Description

This course is designed to explore the concepts underlying the “Wraparound” philosophy in providing care to children, youth, and families with complex needs. The information presented demonstrates how these service delivery values and associated practices have become an integral part of providing effective and efficient interventions within child and family serving systems.

Students will be given is an overview of the Wraparound care coordination process as a vital part of system of care practice and offers a basic understanding of how this approach is conceptualized, practiced, supported, and studied. In addition students will learn that Wraparound is as much a system-level intervention as a practice-level intervention, and the interdisciplinary and community-based structures necessary to ensure that the Wraparound practice model can be used to provide services needed by children and adolescents with the most complex needs and their families in a system of care.
