Arrest/Taken into Custody
When a youth is arrested, they are transported to the Putnam County Jail and will wait for DJJ to call and perform the DRAI screening over the phone.

- After screening youth is released or placed on hold in a separate booking area and waits for transports to DJJ

Detention Hearing

- Hearing occurs within 24 hours of arrest and is in person at the Volusia County Courthouse
- If youth is on supervised release, the parent/guardian will bring youth to detention hearing.
- If scored for secure detention on the DRAI, youth will be transported by detention center.

Volusia County Regional Juvenile Detention Center

- 50-bed secure facility; serves Volusia, Flagler, Putnam & St. Johns County
- Services include education, mental health, substance use, and healthcare

Disposition Hearing
Dispositional options include Probation – Supervision, Commitment, and Probation – Transition and Reentry.

Release from DJJ Residential Commitment Programs

- The Community Reentry Team (CRT) occurs 7-20 days before scheduled release.
- Comprised of DJJ staff, commitment program reentry staff, family members, community mental health providers, courts, juvenile advocacy lawyers, and caregivers
- Plan of care for medications is discussed at first appointment in community
