## III. ANIMAL MEDICAL RECORDS

- Regulated rodent species are assigned a unique intramural USF identification number by the Program Assistant, indicating federal fiscal year received, species, and cumulative number used. A batch of unique identification numbers can be assigned to a group of animals arriving as a group, or during inventory adjustment for animals being weaned as a group.
- Medical records for USDA-regulated rodent species (e.g., guinea pigs, hamsters, naked mole rats, and gerbils) may be maintained as colony records for procedures performed on all animals in a group (e.g., arrival, routine husbandry, vaccinations, preventative medical procedures, surgery, research procedures, or treatments). However, individual treatment(s) of an animal must be an entry specific to that animal.
